Responsible To: CIT Director and In-Charge Counselor

Supervisor Of: Assist counseling staff with campers

Purpose: To be prepared for the responsibility of serving as a Kenbrook summer camp counselor, through participation in a variety of spiritual growth experiences, personal service to campers and staff, and further development of Christian disciplines.

Participating in the CIT program is far more than just another week at camp. It is a ministry and an opportunity to be stretched and challenged in your personal relationship with Jesus Christ. CIT's assist the Kenbrook staff, working as a team, to glorify God by serving the body of Christ and our community through relationships, programs, and services that promote evangelism and discipleship. Consequently it is vital that our staff and CIT's understand that "going the extra mile"—serving beyond the scope of our job description—is often a part of what we are called to do. Whatever our task, we must bear in mind that our service is ultimately unto the Lord. It is for His glory and honor that we serve.

Qualifications:

- Must be at least 16 years old or going into 11th grade in the fall.
- Evidence of a growing, personal relationship with Jesus Christ.
- Interested in improving one's relationship with Jesus Christ and one's ability to serve and lead others.
- Teachable spirit; team-player attitude; servant heart, responsible; industrious, hospitable.

Responsibilities:

- Attend and participate in all CIT group training sessions, including pre-camp orientation. Complete all session assignments in a timely and thorough manner.
- Assist counselors and/or program staff as directed with service to campers through responsible supervision, care, and safety consciousness.
- Assist counselors and/or program staff as directed with activity leadership, evening program, Bible instruction, night watch, and cabin clean up.
- Enthusiastically participate in activities, small group sessions, worship experiences, and any other opportunity that requires interaction with campers or staff.
- Meet one-on-one with the CIT Director as scheduled to discuss spiritual matters, program requirements/concerns, and personal performance.
- Comply with Kenbrook policy and procedures.
- Any other duties as directed by the Youth Ministries Director.
- Maintain your personal daily quiet time throughout the summer
- Be loyal, supportive and edifying to your fellow ministry team members—communicate needs or problems directly to the CIT Director to avoid slandering one another
